The State Regents

- Established in 1941 by an amendment to the constitution.
- Consists of 9 members
- Appointed by the Governor
- Confirmed by the Senate
- Appointed to 9 year terms



Coordinating Board of Control

What is GEAR UP?



The U.S. Department of Education awarded Oklahoma its first state GEAR UP grant totaling \$20.5 million in 1999. The grant was supplemented with a one-year extension of \$4.4 million in 2004. Oklahoma received additional GEAR UP grants totaling \$20.6 million in 2005 and \$34.9 million in 2011.

The grants have been matched by more than \$48 million from state and partner resources. With the addition of the 2011 grant, Oklahoma's GEAR UP program will ultimately receive more than \$80.4 million in federal funds by 2018

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
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Nationally, more than one-quarter (27.9 percent) of adults 25 and older have a bachelor's degree or more, compared to Oklahoma at 22.7 percent.












Tuition and Mandatory Fee Increases in 2009 – 2012


