



It's time to repay my student loans. Where do I find a summary of my loan information?

NSLDS, the National Student Loan Data System, is the U.S. Department of Education's comprehensive database for federal student aid information. NSLDS keeps track of all your Title IV loans and grants. As the borrower, you can access this information at nslds.ed.gov.

What can I find at NSLDS?

- Your loan and/or grant amounts
- Your lender(s) or servicer(s) and their contact information
- Current balances
- Student loan types, statuses and disbursements
- Interest rates
- Your school(s) and their contact information

How do I access NSLDS?

1. Go to nslds.ed.gov.
2. Select "Financial Aid Review."
3. Read the privacy statement. You must accept these terms to use NSLDS.
4. Have your PIN (Personal Identification Number) available. Don't have your PIN? Visit pin.ed.gov.
5. Enter your Social Security number, the first two letters of your last name, your date of birth and your PIN.
6. Select "Submit."
